MAKKOVIK INUIT COMMUNITY COUNCIL BYLAW

A Bylaw Respecting the Establishment of Single Use Plastic Shopping Bags

Whereas single use plastic shopping bags are a very visible component of litter throughout the community; and

Whereas single use plastic shopping bags have a negative impact on our wildlife habitat and are not environmentally friendly; and

Whereas, Makkovik Inuit Community Government, incurs a significant cost to clean up single use plastic shopping bags each year; and

Whereas, local businesses can reduce merchandise cost by not having to purchase single use plastic bags; and

Whereas by using a multi-use shopping bag, residents are reminded of the positive impact of recycling;

Therefore be it resolved that the Makkovik Inuit Community Government enact the following bylaw:

- 1. Makkovik will be free of single use plastic shopping bags effective May 29, 2015
- 2. Retailers in Makkovik will not be permitted to give away or sell plastic shopping bags that are intended for single use.
- 3. A retailer who contravenes this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction of a fine of not more than \$1,000.00.
- 4. Where a contravention continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offense for each day it continues.
- 5. Enacted as a bylaw of the Makkovik Inuit Community Government, in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador, Nunatsiavut, this 28th day of May 2015.
- 6. Exemptions to the bylaw includes small plastic bags that are used to store non-packaged goods such as:
 - a. Dairy products; and
 - b. Fruit, vegetables or nuts; and
 - c. Confectionary; and
 - d. Cooked foods, hot or cold; and
 - e. Ice
 - f. Smaller bags for fresh meat, fish, candy and poultry;
