

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

NUNATSIAVUT GOVERNMENT AFFORDABLE WARMTH & HOME REPAIR PROGRAM 2023: PROJECT MANAGEMENT & COORDINATION

NG is seeking consultants to provide project management and coordination services for the Affordable Warmth & Home Repair Program 2023 within the five Inuit communities of Nain, Hopedale, Postville, Makkovik, and Rigolet. NG will require the successful Proponent to oversee the successful bidder's construction work of the program from July 2 to December 31, 2023. Some of the key context information is provided, below:

- The NG intends to provide a home repair program to provide general home repairs to Labrador Inuit residents in the 5 Inuit Communities of Nunatsiavut;
- The NG has completed inspections of the homes of the Labrador Inuit who applied for repairs under the Program in 2021. Following the inspections, a total of 34 homes have been approved for repairs across the five Inuit Communities (the "Homes"). The NG has determined the scope of work required for the Homes through the inspections.
