

## **PRESIDENTIAL ORDER GRANTING THE TEMPORARY DELEGATION OF A FUNCTION UNDER THE *LABRADOR INUIT LANDS ACT***

**WHEREAS** The Minister of Lands and Natural Resources is responsible for the administration of the *Labrador Inuit Lands Act*;

**AND WHEREAS** due to a conflict of interest, The Minister is unable to execute his decision making powers as it relates to applications A2021-32 and A2023-016 for two separate private interests on Labrador Inuit Lands;

**AND WHEREAS** under section 5.8.10 of the *Labrador Inuit Constitution*, a member of the Nunatsiavut Executive Council may delegate any power or function conferred on that member under an Inuit law, other than a power to make subordinate legislation, to a member of the Nunatsiavut Civil Service or to an Inuit Community Government;

**AND WHEREAS** under section 5.8.11(d) of the *Labrador Inuit Constitution* the delegation of function under section takes effect upon proclamation by the President;

**AND WHEREAS** the Minister of Lands and Natural Resources has proposed, in a Ministerial Directive issued on October 20, 2023, to delegate his functions under the *Labrador Inuit Lands Act* in relation to applications A2021-32 and A2023-016 to the Deputy Minister of Lands and Natural Resources;

**NOW THEREFORE the President of Nunatsiavut** is pleased to make the following Order:

### **Short title**

**1**

This Presidential Order may be cited as the *Delegation of Function (Labrador Inuit Lands Act) Order, 2023*

### **Authority**

This Order is made under section 5.8.11 of the *Labrador Inuit Constitution*

### **Interpretation**

**3**

Unless the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order have the same meaning as in the *Labrador Inuit Constitution*.


**Proclamation**
