Mr. Speaker, I have been giving updates at each Assembly on the videography and photography project. The team will be in Postville and Rigolet in February to gather videos and photographs. Pictures are beginning to be incorporated into current job ads, instead of using generic stock pictures.

Risk assessments are being conducted in all of the Nunatsiavut Government buildings. As per the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety, the definition of a risk assessment is a thorough look at the workplace to identify those things, situations, processes, etc. that may cause harm, particularly to people. Risk assessments are very important. They identify potential and real hazards and risks, then a plan is put in place to remove the risk or mitigate the risk. The ultimate goal is to create and maintain a safe work environment.

Mr. Speaker, the Occupational Health and Safety team has been organizing training for employees. First Aid training has been offered in all communities to date, except for Makkovik.

Upcoming training offerings include Fall Arrest, Powerline Safety, Confined Spaces and Transportation of Dangerous Goods. If there is space available, the training will be opened up to community members.
